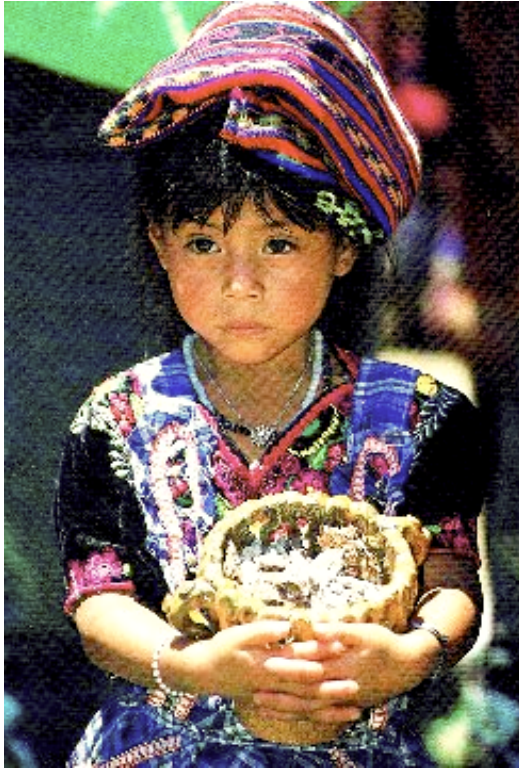

With a very sad heart, yesterday we had to cancel our greatly anticipated trip to the mountains of western Guatemala. Suitcase was packed and airplane ticket in hand and yet I had to postpone the trip.

Many of you know that for many months God has burdened our hearts to preach the message of revival to Mayan Christians in the mountains of Guatemala. The only revival in Latin American history (1932) began in this remote area. We have made plans to travel to this area and each time God has closed the doors. This trip had to be canceled less than 24 hours from when it was to begin.

This week the doors were literally wide open and plans confirmed for us to preach in numerous churches all over this mountainous area. In addition to this, a dear friend who is the Superintendent of more than 3,000 Guatemalan churches, honored me by inviting me to preach this coming Sunday in the church in Totonicapan, where the revival of 1932 began. We also anticipated speaking at a seminary, appearing on a television program, and speaking on radio programs. Our message was to be that God wants to again bless Guatemala with a great revival and to tell them what HE requires of each of them to see revival again come to their country.

The sermons would have been preached in Spanish and one or more pastors would translate the message into their own dialect. Imagine an English speaking North American preaching in Spanish and the message being translated simultaneously into several Mayan dialects. You may recall that nearly two years ago, I taught a 3-hour seminar on prayer and revival to 450 pastors from this area and many became dear friends in a short period of time.

When we left the business world in 1966, we began seeking to live our lives by faith. Over many years we have experienced marvelous evidences of God's love. His word has been truth to our lives. We have never doubted God's promises and especially have claimed the promise He made to us "that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose."(Romans 8:28)

Yesterday (Monday) 24 hours before I was to board my flight for Guatemala, we had \$160. For nearly a week we had believed by faith that God would provide sufficient money to take care of Judy's needs while I was gone and to take care of the expenses we would have in Guatemala. The biggest hurdle (airfare) we had already passed. Our heavenly Father knows why additional money did not arrive.

Rigo, my brother in ministry sold his car yesterday and offered for us to use his money to complete this trip. God did not give me the freedom to accept his offer, but it blessed my heart to see his willingness to give from that which he does not have to give.

Today I have heard from our dear brothers in Guatemala and they have asked, "When do you plan on coming, give us a date?" They are insistent that we come and preach the message of prayer and revival to their churches.

Rigo and I have pondered why God did not provide necessary funds to make this trip. We both know that there is no better place on earth than the center of God's will.

Our last newsletter explained that we would be having a citywide evangelistic crusade in the Costa Rican City known throughout the Americas for the rampant sin of child prostitution. Because this trip was canceled, Rigo will be able to attend a very important crusade-planning meeting in that city.

Even though our hearts ache for not being in the mountains of Guatemala we are at peace being in HIS will.

PRAYER:

- Pray that revival will come to Latin America and to the United States.
- Pray that we will know how to redeem the time that we have here in the states because of the cancellation of this trip.
- Pray that Rigo and the meeting of the pastors this Friday will be blessed with a oneness of spirit and that they will be given wisdom in the planning of the crusade.
- Praise God for what HE is going to do in Latin America and in the United States.
