Today is Judy's birthday and this morning all of our friends in the hotel restaurant sang happy birthday to her. Judy knows them each by their name and much about each of their families so their singing to her was very special.

We had hoped to go to Antigua for Thursday and Friday night to celebrate Judy's birthday but circumstances have caused us to cancel that much-anticipated time apart. We will stay here in Guatemala City and hope to have a special night out at a nice restaurant where we have eaten in the past.

It would take 10 pages to describe what happened Sunday and Monday night in the first church where we preached on this trip. The easiest and best way to describe what happened in each of those services is to say that the Holy Spirit blessed beyond our imagination. Last night I taught for an hour and preached for an hour and God increased exponentially the hunger to know personal revival in the lives of many. Each night the dear pastor and his wife kept us up until late at night asking questions about revival. They have a great hunger to truly love the Lord and know his presence over their lives. Their hunger exemplifies the hunger of a large number of the members of their church.

In two hours we leave for a long drive in traffic to a church that meets under two tents. The roof of their auditorium collapsed under the weight of volcanic ash. You might recall me telling you that we had to wash our hair to remove the ash from that same volcanic eruption. The

nights are cold here and Judy is going dressed like a teddy bear to try to stay warm. Two months ago I preached in this church and the young pastor in his prayer at the close of the service repeated numerous times "Lord begin the revival in me".

Rigo rode six hours on a less than ideal bus to reach the second city. He said that the churches are very small and very poor so that means that he also is having to see the loaves and the fishes multiplied. We both believe that any hardship is worth enduring in order to be used in a significant way by our Lord.
