*** We had the blessing of leading Otto to Christ three years ago and since that time he and his wife have been baptized, formally married in their church, and he is now a leader in his church. We have seen him numerous times at the airport where he shines shoes for a living. It has been glorious to see this young man grow in the grace of our Lord.**

Yesterday morning we left Guatemala possibly for the last time. It has been very difficult for us to think that we might not ever again minister in the country where we have seen God use us mightily for His glory. Guatemala is a country where we have so many children in the Lord and so many dear Christian friends who truly love our Lord, and like us, desire to know the presence of the Lord over their country.

During this 17 day trip to Guatemala we saw many evidences of the beginning of a great revival in that country. PLEASE CONTINUE TO PRAY THAT REVIVAL WILL BEGIN SOON

Numerous times on our trips to or through Guatemala, in the last nearly 4 years, we have taught seminars to several thousand pastors and preached in nearly 70 Guatemalan churches. We have preached in churches in nearly every area of that country. Our message has been centered on how Guatemalan Christians can see the second great revival in the history of Latin America.

We believe with all of our hearts that when revival comes to Guatemala it will eventually spread to the United States and to all of Latin America.

Some months ago a Christian friend chided us for sharing our testimony. I can identify with the apostle Paul in at least one way and that is I cannot stop testifying to the greatness and goodness of what God has done, is doing, and I believe will do in our lives.

BRIEF TESTIMONY OF THIS TRIP

- We challenged two young pastors who arranged our preaching schedule, to find churches whose pastors were younger than 40, who truly loved the Lord, and who longed for personal revival. On this trip, in every church where our loving Lord placed us, HE allowed me to preach to congregations who were extremely attentive and very hungry to hear the message of seeking the Lord with all their heart so they could have personal revival. In each service these dear Christians sat attentatively for at least an hour absorbing like a sponge the message. God blessed me as I studied HIS word and prayed to preach, and HE blessed me as much as HE blessed the congregation as HIS message was preached.
- Nothing blesses me more then to see God bless when I am sick and in great pain. We arrived at one church and it was only because of HIS wonderful grace that I was able to climb the stairs of the platform to sit down in a chair to preach. The message of revival included loving the Lord with all your heart, mind, body, and soul. First I was blessed and then the congregation was blessed and God received all the glory.
- At every point of this trip we both were faced with pain and sickness. Sleepless nights of much prayer. We stayed in the same hotel room for 16 nights. Problem with scheduling conflicts. Travel problems reaching churches. Homebound Judy was so sick she needed a wheelchair to get off the airplane (today she is much better). Because of limited funds we ate the hotels free breakfast and at night would share a bowl of soup. **GOD ALLOWED ALL OF THIS TO KEEP US**

BROKEN SO HE COULD USE US AND WOULD RECEIVE ALL THE GLORY.

- **We have not been able to have the booklet on revival in Guatemala, printed. However more than 100 copies of the 28 pages have been distributed to leaders and pastors of the Central American Mission churches in Western Guatemala. The Iglesia de Dios del Evangelio Completo have graciously agreed to send the booklet as an e-mail attachment to several thousand pastors and members of their churches. God blessed me with the opportunity of speaking about revival for an hour and a half to the Guatemalan ministerial alliance. One leader from each denomination serves on this board.**
- **On this trip Judy and I both had the glorious opportunity of leading people to Christ.**
- **With more than a dozen sons in the Lord in the hotel where we have stayed many, many nights God has allowed me several times to teach the weekly Bible study in the basement of the hotel. This is always a blessing for me**
- **All of our children in the Lord and dozens of Christian friends who also work in the hotel knew that our saying goodbye could be the last time we would see them before we will see them in glory. It was a difficult time for all of us and many tears were shared.**
- **One particular dear friend that we have known and loved from our first trip to Guatemala turned his back and could not watch the hotel bus taking us to the airport. God's word tells**

us that we will be known for our love and we have seen and known the love of many great Guatemalan Christians.

WE KNOW THAT GOD STILL HAS FOR US A FRUITFUL MINISTRY FOR HIS GLORY IN LATIN AMERICA, THEN WHY DO I FEEL THAT THIS WAS OUR LAST TRIP TO GUATEMALA AND POSSIBLY OUR LAST TRIP OF MINISTRY TO LATIN AMERICA?

- Rigo has just returned from Northern Colombia where he organized and prepared an area of that country for three Crusades that will take place the last two weeks of January. He describes this area as the poorest place in all of Latin America. I am burdened of God to not use the money that comes from a handful of you to pay for another trip to preach in Latin America, when we do not have enough resources to prepare and hold the Crusades where Rigo is needed to preach.
- Rigo is a graduate of three Billy Graham Evangelistic Association courses for evangelist in North Carolina. His heart and his gift as an evangelist would have made him famous throughout Latin America if it were not that he has a burden to reach the unlikable, the unclean, and the unlovable in the areas where no one wants to go to preach. This is why Rigo's ministry must increase and mine must decrease. There are not enough funds for both of us to do what God has called us to do and I gladly will support Rigo by traveling across America raising funds for the Crusades he will preach in 2011.

- Some would ask why are we so willing to sacrifice our ministry to let Rigo exercise his gift as an evangelist. You might not remember but in 1968 God called Judy and I to open the upper room (Aposento Alto) in the middle of the market place of San Jose, Costa Rica so we also could reach the unlikable, the unclean, and the unlovable. We will gladly sacrifice anything so that Rigo can preach the message of hope in Jesus Christ to people with no hope of sleeping in a comfortable bed, no hope of having more than one meal a day, and no hope of ever having medical attention for their serious medical problems.
- You cannot believe my mixed feelings. Extremely sad to think that I will be stuck in the United States raising money when I could be in Latin America using my gift of a new testament prophet (exhort, edify, and console). But happy that I will be used to allow God to use my very dear brother Rigo to reach thousands for Christ.

We give thanks to our heavenly father and to each of you who daily pray for both families and for those of you who continue to give sacrificially during hard times, so that our little ministry can win Latin America to Christ. We believe through Crusades and by seeing a great revival begin in one country we will see millions come to Christ.
