Hopefully you know that <u>each of our Crusades</u> are held where no one else would consider preaching a crusade. The poverty and the danger in the areas where God has burdened our hearts, makes us among the very few willing to pay the price both physically and financially to reach out to the very most needy people.

WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Let me tell you about the already very well organized and planned Crusades that Rigo will preach between January 13 and February 1 in Panama and Northern Colombia.

On Rigo's way to Colombia he will stop to preach three nights and one day in San Miguelito Panama (January 14-17). Twelve months ago he preached a week in this dangerous area and saw many come to Christ. You might remember that during one night crusade he heard machine gunfire close by. This community is the center for narcotic distribution for the whole country of Panama. These very poor and persecuted churches were only able to give Rigo \$50 to help cover his expenses for one week of a very fruitful crusade.

From Panama Rigo will fly to northern Colombia where he will preach five Crusade meetings in three days. Three evening services (January 21, 22, and 23) will be in Pivijay population of 75,000 with only 12 churches. Simultaneously, at noon (January

22-23) he will preach another Crusade in a nearby community known as Media Luna (half moon), which is the organizational center for the paramilitary. The cemetery in this area is immense. Nearly every family has lost at least one male family member in the government/guerrilla/drug cartel/and paramilitary war that seems to never end.

A problem that Rigo will face is that Northern Colombia continues to experience horrible flooding.

The 12 churches in Pivijay are <u>extremely excited</u> about our Crusade. They believe the message of Jesus Christ in the Crusade will greatly impact their community and hopefully the ongoing guerilla-drug war.

Rigo will then make the very arduous trip East to hold the Crusade in Rio Hacha (January 28, 29, and 30), a city of 250,000 with 30 churches (16 church are totally involved in the crusade). This very poor city is located close to the Venezuelan border and the Caribbean coast.

In between the Crusades in Pivijay and Rio Hacha he will hold (January 26) a pastor's seminar for 180 of the 200 pastors in the large city of Santa Marta. There is a standing invitation for him to preach a large crusade in this very large city, but remember our burden is to reach the people who are unreachable or who by many seem to be not worth the effort to reach for Jesus Christ.

Because of poverty levels both in the churches and communities we must provide the sound equipment (loud speakers etc) and help with the rental of chairs in each Colombian crusade. Rigo will stay in very inexpensive (uncomfortable) hotels and will travel from city to city by the most economic transportation available.

TODAY JANUARY 2nd OUR LITTLE MINISTRY HAS \$336 AND NO FORESEEABLE INCOME IN THE NEAR FUTURE. BY JANUARY 10TH (9 days) WE NEED TO SEND RIGO A \$1700 MONEYGRAM FOR THE EXPENSES OF THIS TRIP.
