

Dear Prayer Partners, Friends, and Loved Ones,

Despite significant health problems this trip has been greatly blessed of the Lord.

You cannot believe the joy that I feel that as of this afternoon our loving heavenly Father has used us to personally lead five people to Christ. Our prayer is for God to continue using us to reach others for Christ before we leave for San Diego on Tuesday.

Even though, with one exception, I have not preached more than one time a day, HE has used this old and beat up body to glorify the name of Jesus Christ in ways that have been amazing.

We recorded six programs on a great Christian television station and were interviewed on a radio station that reaches all of Guatemala, a large area of Mexico, and parts of El Salvador and Honduras. From the radio station interview more than 50 people have e-mailed us requesting a copy of the booklet on revival. Two requests came from Mexico and today we continue to receive requests.

Very dear friends who have been missionaries in Guatemala for 60 years gave us a love offering to be used toward the printing of at least 20,000 booklets. A Christian printer has the booklet and is ready to start printing while another dear friend has happily agreed to see that 2 to 5 copies of it are distributed to all the churches of every denomination in Guatemala. **PLEASE PRAY FOR FUNDS NECESSARY TO BEGIN PRINTING!**

We honestly believe the more weak we are, the more God has been able to use us for his glory. Let me give you a few examples.

- In a nine-hour period of time, despite significant stomach pain and weakness, God gave me the strength to record six television programs, preach an anointed message to a dear congregation in San Juan Sacatepequez, and have dear redemptive fellowship with the pastor.
- One day God blessed beyond measure a radio interview and after a small lunch we went up a mountain to San Lucas Sacatepequez, where I taught a three-hour seminar on prayer and revival to a very small number of pastors from very small and poor churches. You cannot believe how blessed I was for this opportunity of my Lord to speak with these humble men who absorbed, often with tears, every word God gave me during that nonstop three-hour period of time. Then we started down the mountain to San Miguel de Pitapa where I arrived 30 minutes after the service had begun and preached an hour and twenty minute sermon. Despite my pain and tiredness plus at times inability to communicate effectively, my loving Lord still used the message HE had given me, in the lives of many.
- One night we went up another mountain to preach in a very poor area which is known as a red zone, which means there is continual physical danger from gangs and drug traffickers. These are "our people", like the people we worked with in the marketplaces of San Jose, Costa Rica and San Salvador, El Salvador. These are people who have little hope of ever

having what you and I take for granted but are so anxious to hear God's Word preached and lived before them. When I finished an hour and a half sermon, two brothers in the Lord helped me down from the pulpit and three times we almost fell. That night Judy and I ate dinner in our room at one o'clock in the morning. But oh! what a joy it is to be used of the Lord in the lives of those who love Christ Jesus.

We are truly grateful for those of you who have prayed for us during this trip. Our great God honored your prayers by giving us almost unbelievable opportunities to preach and share the message of the love of Jesus. You may not realize my doctor gave me permission to make this trip five days before we left for Guatemala.

Let me explain: we have preached in more than 100 churches in Guatemala and have grown to love and appreciate so many of the pastors of these churches. They have reciprocated our love and we like they are sad that on this trip we could not be with more of them in their churches. Because of the open heart surgery we cannot go above 4,500 feet and that restricts us greatly from preaching in more mountainous areas of Guatemala where we believe a great revival has already begun.

Our team member, Rigo, tonight finished a three-day crusade in a very remote area of Costa Rica. We have not been able to communicate with him but expect to hear from him tomorrow afternoon as he begins his trip back to San Jose. We're grateful

for your intercessory prayer for this crusade. [Rigo and I know that the fruitfulness in souls is due to your prayers.](#)
